This strategic direction recognizes the connection between reliable infrastructure and building and maintaining the economy.


#### **GOALS**

### **First Year Actions**

- Cost analysis on internet install to fill the gaps: ARP / Jan 22
- Implement fed stimulus funding strategy: ARP, Board / Start Feb 22
- 3. Convene with schools, cities, townships to update current internet plan: Cmsr Erickson/ April 2022
- Accelerate planning for road projects: Board/ Jul 2022
- 5. Internet accessibility and speed research project: EDA/ July 2022

- 1. Everyone in the County has access to highspeed internet or satisfactory to people's needs
- 2. Current fiber infrastructure in fully utilized
- 3. Increased number of business startups and expansions
- 4. All available sites for development are cataloged
- 5. Economic development efforts are well-coordinated across all agencies

#### **GOALS**

- Improve services through cooperation and coordination
- Seek innovation grants that will award the County's efforts to combine efforts



#### **First Year Actions**

- 1. Two communities share services
- County facilitate emergency services collaboration: EM/ Dec 2021
- 3. Promote the accessibility of attending board meetings: Admin, Board/ Mar 2022
- 4. County convenes cities, schools discussion toward coordination: Admin / June 2022
- 5. Pursue possibility of a professional grant writer: Admin/ Start June 2022
- 6. Hire a community facilitator: Admin / July 2022
- 7. Have 2-3 fire depts share staff/training resources to create model for others: EM/Sept 2022

- Local governments are collaborating in new ways
- 2. Joint fire collaboration
- 3. Schools designing for needs of students together
- 4. Diverse representation on board with multiple applicants
- Awareness of grants and increased number of grants awarded (Area receiving more grant dollars)





# **Building a Thriving Community**



Building a thriving community requires a feeling of safety, availability of healthy activities, connecting with nature, amenities for spending time enjoyably, healthy food security and staying current with technology needs.

#### **GOALS**

- Establish state of the art EC charging stations in strategic locations
- Expand trail systems within and between parks to create links
- Provide food opportunities to those who cannot meet their own needs
- Promote the beauty and opportunities that exist in the County
- Develop a recruitment and retention plan for peace officers
- Bring people back to become contributing members of the community

#### **First Year Actions**

- 1. Showcase restorative justice successes: RJ / Feb 2022
- Establish EV committee to investigate possibilities EDA, Electric Companies, Cities and Townships/ Feb 22
- I.D. \$ and partners to host EV charging stations: GW/Q1-Q4 2022
- 4. Develop recruitment and retention program for public safety: EM, Sheriff, HR/ Oct, 2022
- 5. Create trails within the parks: Parks, Comm Spec, Fairfax City Admin / Aug 2022
- Develop County-wide visitors guide: EDA, Cities, Comm Spec / Dec 2022
- 7. Form parks and trail-system collaborative group to complete trail plan (and seek money): Parks, GW / Dec 2022
- 8. Install I-net service at the parks: Board, Parks/ May 2023
- 9. Connect 2 parks via trails: Parks, HWY, ES and GW / 2023
- 10. Mobile food shelf is running: Hospital, SHIP Coord, Food Shelf and Board, CCT / November, 2023
- 11. Food deserts initiative (to address access issues for healthy food): SHIP, EDA, Cities, Community members / June 2023

- Increase the number of daycare providers to meet the needs of the area
- Increase housing to attract and retain residents and businesses





### **First Year Actions**

- 1. Daycare needs study: Cmsr Snow / Jan 2022
- Review childcare models: Cmsr Snow / Mar 2022
- Assess each City's current long-range plan: Solid Waste Admin /Jun 2022
- Revitalize open buildings in downtown (transition housing): Econ Dev Coord / Jul 2022
- 5. Encourage cities to replicate residential abatement program: Econ Dev Coord / Jul 2022
- Pursue Utilization of tax forfeited parcels for housing development: Cmsr Snow, Admin, EDA / Nov 2022
- Replicated 4-pod family daycare model: Fairfax City Admin/Sep 2023
- 8. Ordinance changes to encourage development: ES Director/ 2023

- 1. At least 50 more daycare spots open
- 2. Additional building sites for multi-housing
- 3. Blighted property replaced with higher quality housing
- 4. Vacant property downtown is used for housing
